I. Introduction

Study-in-Japan Fair has been conducted by **Cambodia-Japan Cooperation Center** (**CJCC**) since 2008 with continuous support from the **Ministry of Education**, **Youth and Sport (MoEYS)**, **Embassy of Japan in Cambodia**, **Royal University of Phnom Penh** (**RUPP**), **Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA**), other Cambodian and Japanese educational institutions. This year, in a close collaboration with **Global Network Project to Promote Study in Japan (ASEAN)/Okayama University**, the Study-in-Japan Fair 2024 was conducted from November 7 to November 8 in order to promote the study in Japan and share information to the public, especially students who are interested in pursuing their higher education in Japan.

As an annually, before the fair day, we held the Opening and Welcome Dinner with the purpose to build up the connection by allowing the attendees to share and exchange the information for their further cooperation in the future. The Opening and Welcome Dinner took place at Restaurant of Hotel Emion Phnom Penh (18th Floor) where we had around 48 participants attended the event including the organizers, representative of every supporter, representative of the Japanese universities/institutions, representative of the Cambodia educational institutions and other honorable guests.

The fair was successfully completed with the participation of **12 Japanese universities** and institutions, **4 of supporters and 1,000 public participants** (students, teachers, parents, and etc.) who wish to pursue their study in Japan and wish to know about study in Japan information.




After the fair, we sent our evaluation form to participants in order to collect their feedback on

our event.


We received 26 responses and the results are as the following.

Overall, the Study-in-Japan Fair 2024 ended successfully with 1,000 physically participants in total, compared to 1,200 of the Study-in-Japan Fair 2023. It was 200 participants decreased from the fair last year, as a result from the changed schedule of Baccalaureate Examination from the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport (MoEYS) this year which was a bit late conducted in early October and result announcement in late October. However, as recently announcement from the MoEYS that Baccalaureate Examination will be taken early for the Fiscal Year 2025 to meet the schedule of new enrollment for universities. We hope the Study-in-Japan Fair 2025 will be able to conduct in October as annually.
